A LETTER FROM LEADERSHIP

On Resilience and Renewal

2024 was a year of profound transition—and transformation—for The Family Partnership. The families and communities we serve and the nonprofit landscape faced urgent and unprecedented challenges, many of which still continue today. Guided by 146 years of trust and partnership, we focused on TFP’s mission and worked to strengthen TFP’s foundation for the years ahead. That focus ensured the delivery of culturally responsive approaches and created new pathways for healing.

More than 3,200 individuals from over 1,100 households participated in core service programs. Staff and managers worked together so families could smoothly engage in the multiple supports TFP provides. We celebrated achievements like those in our preschools, where 90% of children graduated kindergarten-ready and 100% demonstrated age-appropriate executive function—the strongest predictor of success in school and life.

Your support was vital as we drove innovation and thought leadership at local, state, and national levels. With funding from the State of Minnesota, we launched EGG Toolkit pilots across the state—bringing cutting-edge brain science into early childhood programs in eight urban, suburban, and rural sites.

We expanded our national presence as the newest member of Children’s Home Society of America and shared community-informed strategies with the Biden administration to prevent family disruption and strengthen opportunity.

All of this work reflects the heart of The Family Partnership: to meet families where they are and clear the path to success. Even in a year of extraordinary difficulty, families achieved strong outcomes, our programs upheld the highest national standards, and we took meaningful steps toward a long-term vision that will carry us forward. One of those steps was the establishment of an interim strategic framework that positioned the organization for a successful transition to a permanent CEO.

This report reflects our resilience and renewal—the kind of progress that grows only through deep roots of trust, innovation and partnership. Thank you for investing in this legacy work of generational healing so the next generation can thrive.

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Impact Through Services

Early Childhood Education and Care

The Family Partnership provides cultural responsive early childhood education and care. In 2024, **101 children aged 5 or under** were served in our preschools, while **222 families** were served across all early childhood programs.

PROGRAMS

Preschools

Our preschools provide high-quality, multicultural and therapeutic services designed to ensure every child has a path to learning and success.

EGG Toolkit

EGG Toolkit is our early childhood curriculum designed to build executive function and self-regulation skills in preschools, parenting groups and home visiting programs.



90% of children in our preschools graduated kindergarten-ready, compared to **60%** of children in Minnesota and **52%** of children in households with low incomes.

ACCREDITATIONS

Rated as Strong Beginnings Centers by Hennepin County and the Minnesota Department of Human Services, and Four Star Parent Aware rated.



Impact Through Services

Mental Health Therapies

The Family Partnership provides Mental Health Therapies that utilize evidence-based, trauma-informed approaches. In 2024, we supported **1067 individuals from 427 households** on their healing journeys.

PROGRAMS

Outpatient Mental Health

Individual, couples, family, and group therapy sessions to address challenges, set goals, and promote mental well-being.

Multi-Systemic Therapy

Intensive treatment for at-risk youth (ages 12-17) living at home, aimed at preventing out-of-home placement or school expulsion.

School-Linked Mental Health

Counseling for youth up to age 21 in schools across Richfield, Brooklyn Center, and Minneapolis.

Developmental Therapies

Behavioral therapy, including play therapy, for children under 6 at our preschools and those referred by Head Start in Hennepin County.

Diversity Social Work Advancement Program (DSWAP)

Clinical internships for advanced-standing master's students from underrepresented communities, enhancing diversity among providers.



92% of clients with 6+ months of services made progress towards their treatment goals

Family Home Visiting

The Family Partnership provides Mental Health Therapies that utilize evidence-based, trauma-informed approaches. In 2024, we supported **686 children and their parents from 242 families** on their healing journeys.

PROGRAMS

Parenting Support Outreach Program

Connects parents with community resources for family health and stability, offering coaching and education to prevent Child Protective Services (CPS) involvement.

Parenting for the Future

Assists parents with cognitive limitations who have young children at home, providing parenting education, community resources, and activities to strengthen parent-child bonds.

Healthy Families America

Supports pregnant individuals and new parents/caregivers in building healthy, nurturing relationships with their children.

Parent Capacity-Building Program

Works with CPS-involved parents to enhance parenting skills and family well-being through in-home coaching, education, and connections to community resources.

Promising Practices Home Visiting

We partner with parents and caregivers of preschoolers aged 3-to-5-years-old for healthy child development and family well-being.



81% of CPS involved parents demonstrated increased knowledge of parenting and child development, leading to fewer open CPS cases

Anti-Sex Trafficking

The Family Partnership offers anti-sex trafficking services through our PRIDE program (Promoting Recovery, Independence, Dignity, and Equality). In 2024, we supported **660 individuals aged 16 to 62** on their journey toward safer, more vibrant, and self-sufficient futures.



78% of PRIDE participants decreased involvement in the commercial sex industry

Thanks to the generous support of our donors and other funding partners, we maintained excellence in direct services last year while we pursued new funding sources and advocated for needed public policy solutions.
